LEAF AND BRUSH PICKUP

-Leaves will be picked up at the curb on May 4th and May 11th; leaves must be in brown paper leaf bags. Plastic bags will not be picked up. Brush will be picked up at the curb on May 5th and May 12th. Brush must be cut no longer than 4 feet and no wider than 3 inches in diameter and must be bundled and tied so one person can handle the bundle. Piles of brush not bundled will not be picked up. Brush must be at the curb by 7:00am on the day of pickup. Do not cut up in small pieces. This is a brush pick-up only. Entire trees which have been removed will not be picked up. Brush from lot clearing and firewood will not be picked up either. Street Sweeping - The Department of

Public Works will be having the roads swept starting late May. The dates for road sweeping will be posted on the Borough Website and Facebook page.

STARTING MAY 1ST SOLID WASTE WILL BE PICKED UP ON TUESDAYS;

Road Repairs DPW will be working on the roads during the summer months. Be prepared to have your vehicle off the road as they will be doing basic asphalt patching.

Land Use Board: The Land Use Board meets the fourth Tuesday of the month. The Board is working on updating our zoning ordinances and zoning map. The Borough was approved for a Local Planning Services Grant and will be working with individuals from Trenton to complete a Main Street Strategic Plan. SOLID WASTE AND BULK PICKUP DAY OF THE WEEK CHANGE

The Borough of Ogdensburg went out for bids last fall for solid waste and recycling pickup. On November 22, 2022 the Borough received one bid from Blue Diamond Inc. The bid from Blue Diamond increased the costs for the same services from \$17,775.00 per month to \$24,000.00 per month. An increase of approximately 24%. These large increases have become such a problem for municipalities all across NJ that the State has taken the unprecedented step of providing municipalities with an exception to the 1977 appropriations cap law for 2023 budgets.

On December 12, 2022 the Mayor and Council adopted resolution 75 -2022 rejecting bids received for

solid waste and recycling contract and authorizing the Borough Clerk to advertise for a rebid. The Mayor and Council also adopted resolution 74-2022 authorizing a 60-day extension of solid waste and recycling with Blue Diamond Disposal, Inc until March 1, 2023.



Garbage and Recycling Information (See enclosed calendar of pickup dates)

See enclosed calendar for pickup day changes. Household Garbage is limited to (2) 32 gallon containers. If you have additional trash and need to place more household garbage out for pick-up, you will need to purchase a sticker at the Borough Hall at \$2.00 per sticker and place one sticker on each additional bag of garbage. Beginning in May the first Tuesday of the month one bulky item is per-

mitted to be left at the curb. Residents are permitted to put out a washer, dryer, dishwasher, carpet, furniture, treadmill, microwave or refrigerator. A refrigerator and/or any item that contains Freon must have a certified Freon free sticker on it before Blue Diamond can take it. CONSTRUCTION MA-TERIALS WILL NOT BE PICKED

UP. Electronic waste will not be picked up, televisions, desktop or laptop computers, monitors etc. The Borough's recycling center on Brooks Flat Road is open Saturday mornings from 8:00am to noon; if the dumpsters are filled up before noon the recycling center will close early. Reminder all cardboard must be broken down, no plastic bags and cans and bottles rinsed clean.

Solid Waste and bulk pickup change continued—Heater Pond

February 16, 2023 was the rebid opening; once again the Borough received one bid that was from Blue Diamond Inc. The only way to achieve savings was to approve option 2. Therefore a resolution was passed authorizing option 2. This new cost is \$21,000.00 per

Mayor Hutnick has formed a committee to look into this situation with solid waste and recycling and to check into other options that could save costs for the borough in the future.

The Mayor and Council meet the second and fourth Monday's of the month. Meetings are open to the public. If you have any questions, comments or concerns please attend a meeting.

Heaters Pond Opening Day: The Mayor and Council are looking to open the pond at the end of June; pending lifeguard availability. As you know, there are two lifeguards on duty at all times. The Borough is now hiring lifeguards for the 2023 swim season. If interested pick up an application at the Ogdensburg Municipal Building.
