LEAF AND BRUSH PICKUP—STREEP SWEEPING-ROAD REPAIRS

LEAF AND BRUSH PICKUP

-Leaves will be picked up at the curb on April 17 and April 24 leaves must be in brown paper leaf bags. Plastic bags will not be picked up. Brush will be picked up at the curb on April 21 and April 25. Brush must be cut no longer than 4 feet and no wider than 3 inches in diameter and must be bundled and tied so one

person can handle the bundle. Piles of brush not bundled will not be picked up. Brush must be at the curb by 7:00am on the day of pickup. Do not cut up in small pieces. This is a brush pick-up only. Entire trees which have been removed will not be picked up. Brush from lot clearing and firewood will not be picked up either. **Street**Sweeping - The Department of

Public Works will be having the roads swept starting late May.
The dates for road sweeping will be posted on the Borough Website and Facebook page. Road Repairs DPW will be working on the roads during the summer months. Be prepared to have your vehicle off the road as they will be doing basic asphalt patching

Please be aware of phone scams, most of which target the elderly, such as IRS calling and threatening to arrest you unless immediate payment is made. The IRS only communicates via letters that are mailed. There are also phone scams where the caller says that a loved one has been arrested such as a niece, nephew or grandchild and the caller demands payment to keep them out of jail That call is a scam, especially if they ask you to wire money and send l-tunes cards. Awareness of these scams

is the best prevention and if you aren't sure, call and ask the Police before doing anything further.





Please insure you lock your vehicle and residence doors; if you notice any suspicious or criminal activity, contact the Borough Police Department. Reminder if your car has a push button start remember to remove your key fob from the car.









Dog waste is a nuisance in many neighborhoods in Ogdensburg. The law requires that all owners walking their dogs must pick up any waste left deposited by their dog on any street, sidewalk, roadway, park land, private or public property. Dog waste contains bacteria that can make other dogs and humans sick. The bacteria in dog waste can pollute our drinking water and our streams and rivers

killing fish, wildlife and plants.

Please be considerate of your
neighbors and pick up after your
dog. Help keep Ogdensburg clean
and healthy. If you have not yet
obtained your dog or cat licenses
they were to be renewed by January 31, 2025 with late fees of
\$5.00 per month beginning in
March for each pet registered late.
Rabies Vaccinations must be good
past November 1st, 2025.

Reminder dog and cat licenses are now \$10.00 each. **Board of Health:** The Board of Health meets the first Wednesday of the month except for the months of July and August. If interested in volunteering on the Board of Health please call 973-827-3444 ext. 223.

Garbage and Recycling Information (See enclosed calendar of pickup dates)

Household Garbage is limited to (2) 32 gallon containers. If you have additional trash and need to place more household garbage out for pick-up, you will need to purchase a sticker at the Borough Hall at \$2.00 per sticker and place one sticker on each additional bag of garbage. The first Tuesday of the month one bulky item is permitted to be left at the curb. Residents are permitted to put out a

washer, dryer, dishwasher, carpet, furniture, treadmill, microwave or refrigerator. A refrigerator and/ or any item that contains Freon must have a certified Freon free sticker on it before Blue Diamond can take it. CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS WILL NOT BE PICKED UP. Electronic waste will not be picked up, televisions, desktop or laptop computers, monitors etc.

The Borough's recycling center on Brooks Flat Road is open Saturday mornings from 8:00am to noon; if the dumpsters are filled up before noon the recycling center will close early. Reminder all cardboard must be broken down, no plastic bags and cans and bottles rinsed clean.

Stormwater Pollution

Easy Things You Can Do Every Day To Protect Our Water

A Guide to Healthy Habits for Cleaner Water

Pollution on streets, parking lots and lawns is washed by rain into storm drains, then directly to our drinking water supplies and the ocean and lakes our children play in. Fertilizer, oil, pesticides, detergents, pet waste, grass clippings: You name it and it ends up in our water.

Stormwater pollution is one of New Jersey's greatest threats to clean and plentiful water, and that's why we're all doing something about it.

By sharing the responsibility and making small, easy changes in our daily lives, we can keep common pollutants out of stormwater. It all adds up to cleaner water, and it saves the high cost of cleaning up once it's dirty.

As part of New Jersey's initiative to keep our water clean and plentiful and to meet federal requirements, many municipalities and other public agencies including

colleges and military bases must adopt ordinances or other rules prohibiting various activities that contribute to stormwater pollution. Breaking these rules can result in fines or other penalties.



As a resident, business, or other member of the New Jersey community, it is important to know these easy things you can do every day to protect our water.

Limit your use of fertilizers and pesticides

- Do a soil test to see if you need a fertilizer.
- Do not apply fertilizers if heavy rain is predicted.
- Look into alternatives for pesticides.
- Maintain a small lawn and keep the rest of your property or yard in a natural state with trees and other native vegetation that requires little or no fertilizer.
- If you use fertilizers and pesticides, follow the instructions on the label on how to correctly apply it.



Make sure you properly store or discard any unused portions.

Properly use and dispose of hazardous products

- Hazardous products include some household or commercial cleaning products, lawn and garden care products, motor oil, antifreeze, and paints.
- Do not pour any hazardous products down a storm drain because storm drains are usually connected to local waterbodies and the water is not treated.

- If you have hazardous products in your home or workplace, make sure you store or dispose of them properly. Read the label for guidance.
- Use natural or less toxic alternatives when possible.
- Recycle used motor oil.
- Contact your municipality, county or facility management office for the locations of hazardous-waste disposal facilities.



Keep pollution out of storm drains

- Municipalities and many other public agencies are required to mark certain storm drain inlets with messages reminding people that storm drains are connected to local waterbodies.
- Do not let sewage or other wastes flow into a stormwater system.

Clean up after your pet

- Many municipalities and public agencies must enact and enforce local pet-waste rules.
- An example is requiring pet owners or their keepers to pick up and properly dispose of pet waste dropped on public or other people's property.
- Make sure you know your town's or agency's requirements and comply with them. It's the law. And remember to:
 - Use newspaper, bags or pooper-scoopers to pick up wastes.
 - Dispose of the wrapped pet waste in the trash or unwrapped in a toilet.
 - Never discard pet waste in a storm drain.

Don't feed wildlife

- Do not feed wildlife, such as ducks and geese, in public areas.
- Many municipalities and other public agencies must enact and enforce a rule that prohibits wildlife feeding in these areas.



Dispose of yard waste properly

- Keep leaves and grass out of storm drains.
- If your municipality or agency has yard waste collection rules, follow them.
- Use leaves and grass clippings as a resource for compost.
- Use a mulching mower that recycles grass clippings into the lawn.

Don't litter

- Place litter in trash receptacles.
- Recycle. Recycle. Recycle.
- Participate in community cleanups.
